

THE PEOPLE

If there is one thing that sets Greece apart from any other holiday destination on the planet is the warmth of the Greek people; an open heart and genuine hospitality is part of their DNA. Greeks love to welcome and embrace visitors.

Cretans in particular are the friendliest and most hospitable people in the country. Do not be surprised if you are greeted by a stranger in Crete, since every visitor is considered as guest. They are proud to believe, that this is inherited from Zeus Xenios, the most important God in the Greek pantheon and ancient patron of hospitality, who according to the legend was born in a Cretan cave. Cretans are a distinctive clan of Greeks with their own spirited music and dances, remarkable cuisine, and traditions. The official language is Greek, English is widely spoken but Cretans love to express themselves using their own local dialects. Proud, patriotic, and fierce, these famously hospitable people, maintaining a rich connection to their culture, will often identify themselves as Cretans before they say they are Greeks!

It is not surprising that visitors often develop lasting friendships with a local, even if they come from thousands of miles away. If you let the locals lead you, they will show you how to indulge in the beauties of the island, the local gastronomy, the dancing, the singing, and their customs. The best way to start your journey is by sharing with them a shot of Tsikoudia. Tsikoudia (or Raki) the most genuine expression of unique Cretan hospitality, is the local transparent alcoholic distillate from grapes that builds and strengthens the social bonds and enhances the expression of deep emotions.

THE ISLAND

GEOGRAPHY

Crete is the largest and most populous Greek island (625.000 permanent inhabitants), the 5th largest in the Mediterranean, and 88th largest island in the world. It has an elongated shape and a total area of over 8.335 square kilometers (5.179 mi) with 1.000 km (621 mi) of coastline. It is not a secret that Crete boasts some of the most beautiful and cleanest beaches in Greece, a great number of which is awarded a Blue Flag (prestigious EU certification). Crete, with lerapetra being the southernmost city in Europe, is actually closer to Lybia and the African coast, than it is to the Greek mainland. Thanks to its geographical location, climate, diverse natural beauty as well as its unique cultural and historical treasures it is one of the most prosperous areas in Greece and almost a small universe itself. Here you can admire the remnants of brilliant civilizations, explore glorious beaches, imposing mountain ranges, impressive caves, fertile valleys, and breathtaking waterfalls in steep gorges.

CLIMATE

With over 300 days of sunshine Crete enjoys not one but two distinct climates! The Mediterranean climate is typical of the northern coast of Crete, while in the southern part the climate is North African. In the hot summer months, the sea breeze offers pleasant temperatures but in winter do not be surprised if you see the high mountains covered with snow, where the locals enjoy winter sports.

FLORA

Blessed Crete also hosts a large number of rare flora and fauna species. In the valleys and the semi mountainous areas one can find more than 100 endemic varieties of flowers, plants, and herbs. The vegetation is deep green and olive trees have thrived on the island for centuries. Near the small village of Kavousi in the region of Lasithi, you can visit one of the oldest olive trees in the world that is still pretty much alive. The impressive palm tree forest –variety Phoenix Theophrasti or Cretan date palm – in Vai Beach, Sitia, is the biggest and most important palm forest in Europe. Despite the fact that the island is well-known by the massive olive groves, vineyards and endless citrus groves, the truth is that almost every other kind of fruit grows on the island. Thanks to the North African climate different types of tropical fruit such as banana, kiwi, mango, avocado and many others, also thrive on the southern coast of Crete.

FAUNA

Crete is home to animals growing nowhere else in the world. The most famous of them is the wild Cretan goat, known as Agrimi or Kri Kri. This beautiful creature lives in the protected reserve of Theodorou island (opposite Chania) and in the gorge of Samaria. Other rare endemic animals are the Cretan wildcat and the Cretan shrew. According to the Greek mythological tradition, in an attempt to please the god Zeus, Hercules drove all harmful animals away from Crete. As a result, all animals in Crete are harmless. During prehistoric times, Crete even used to have its very own variety of elephant, a dwarf mammoth.

HISTORY

Crete is the birthplace of the modern European civilization. The history of the island can be traced as far back as the 7th millennium BC, more than four millennia before the Minoan civilization appearing on Crete. As a matter of fact, the history of Crete is older than the history of the continent itself! The Minoan city of Knossos, now home to one of the most visited archaeological sites in Greece, is considered to be the oldest city in Europe. Another interesting fact about Crete is that the island became again part of the Greek State in December 1913, after endless years of foreign occupation.

ECONOMY

Despite the fact that the local economy is mostly based in the tourism industry, agriculture is still an important asset, so much so that Crete is one of the few islands in Greece, which could still support itself independently, even if it didn't rely on seasonal tourists. The entrance points to Crete for the vast majority of the visitors coming from all over the world are the two international airports. One that serves East Crete is in the capital town Heraklion and the other serving West Crete is in Chania. Apart from the above, there is also a small airport in Sitia in East Crete only for domestic flights. Another important element that adds to the economic growth of the island, are the internationally acclaimed universities that attract numerous Greek and foreign students.

THE CULTURE

FOLKLORE

The Cretan spirit is proud and rebellious, and culture is the soul of Crete, revealed through several events and numerous traditions preserved until today. Weddings, baptisms (christenings), feasts, festivals and religious celebrations are big occasions with huge numbers of guests and are always framed with Cretan music and dance. They take place at village squares or near churches, reviving customs of the Minoan ages. The entertainment lasts for days, with nonstop music, dancing, singing, and eating. People come together and visitors are more than welcome to join the festivities, since this relates to the practice of 'Filoxenia' or Hospitality according to which, the tourists to Crete are considered as guests and therefore friends.

The Cretan Lyra, the most popular of all the musical instruments, is an ancestor of most European bowed musical instruments and a surviving form of the medieval Byzantine Lyra. There is also no music without the Mandolin, the Laouto (or Cretan lute) and the unique Askomandoura which is a kind of bagpipe. Along with the Lyra are usually performed short rhyming, often improvised poems, called the Mantinada. The name of this unique and own form of poetry comes from the Venetian term matinada, meaning morning song. They usually celebrate love, friendship, and the island itself, but they can also be sad and even sang in funerals. Among the most distinguishing features of Cretan culture is the extraordinary folk dancing. The most emblematic dance, spirited and bursting with national pride is the Pentozali, historically performed by men as a wardance. An authentic example of Cretan culture is also the Cretan cuisine, popular for its unique quality and taste, considered to be the epitome of the Mediterranean cuisine. Fresh local products are used to create delicious dishes: meat, cheese, fish, vegetables, herbs, honey, yogurt, olive oil, wine and of course, tsikouda (or raki) take their own place on the Cretan table.

RELIGION

Crete is known for its strong religious past. From the Ancient shrines in the Palace of Knossos to dozens of monasteries and various places of worship, the island is full of religious monuments that attest to the importance of religion in Crete. This destination is indeed one of the cradles of orthodoxy since the beginning of Christianity. As a religious community, superstition and belief in the evil eye are also very common.

ART & CRAFTS

The locals have always been fascinated by crafts, be it weaving, pottery or even leather product. Knife manufacturers in Chania and Heraklion convert steel into the famous Cretan knife, the inseparable companion of each Cretan. Engraved depictions and poems adorn the blades. Women's cooperatives in all major villages still weave on the loom, just like women did in the Minoan times. Sariki, the Cretan head scarf with fringes resembling tears, symbolizes lamentation for the hardships Crete experienced in the past centuries. The black Sariki is worn as a sign of mourning, while the white Sariki is worn as a sign of joy during weddings, feasts, births, and christenings. Wood and marble sculptors give life to materials of the Cretan land by carving logs and stones and by manufacturing elaborate works, mainly of ecclesiastical art.

FAMOUS CRETANS

Crete was the birthplace of the Cretan Renaissance painter El Greco as well as of the famous writer Nikos Kazantzakis. In the town of Chania was born not only the singer Nana Mouskouri but also the Cretan actor Yannis Anastassakis who changed his name to John Aniston and is the father of the famous Hollywood actress Jennifer Aniston.

HORSE RIDING

If you wish to ride for fun, take private lessons with a certified instructor or just enjoy a refreshment watching the prideful and loving horses in action, then this is the place for you.

HIKING

Crete, with more than 95% of its soil consisting of limestone, is a land of canyons. For millions of years, the geological upheavals are reflected strongly in the intense relief of the island. While mountains rose, the river water continued its corrosional route through the limestone terrain, forming today's "land of gorges". With more than 400 canyons, Crete hosts the largest number of gorges in Greece, many of which are very popular to hikers. Among the easiest to explore are Sarakina, Pefki, Butterfly, Milonas and Richtis gorge.

CYCLING

Yearning to explore the great outdoors? lerapetra and its surroundings offer an abundance of opportunities for either road cyclists or mountain bikers. You can complete a full loop of Bramiana lake (7km/4.35mi), visit nearby beaches or discover the beauty of mountain villages surrounded by lush vegetation. There are bicycle and equipment options that suit the needs of both beginners and more experienced bikers.

JEEP SAFARI

Going On Excursions

- Since you are visiting one of the most sun-kissed islands of Europe a hat, a bottle of water and sunscreen are essential especially on hot summer days.
- Comfortable shoes are always recommended.

Visiting Beaches

- Sunbeds with umbrella come at extra charge. Sometimes this charge is waived if you order a snack or a beverage from the snack bar.
- Depending on the direction of the winds (Meltemi) blowing in the summertime in Greece, some beaches are more favored than others. The Concierge will be happy to assist you in making the best choice.

Visiting Museums and Archaeological Sites

- EU senior citizens 65+ are entitled to reduced rates of single tickets upon presentation of their ID card or passport for verification of their age and country of origin.
- Their operation may be suspended due to restoration works on holidays or for any other reason without previous notice. It is advisable to consult with the Concierge before your visit.

Visiting Monasteries

• Appropriate clothing for everyone is required otherwise entry may not be allowed. Gentlemen should avoid sleeveless clothing and shorts above the knee whereas ladies are advised to wear skirts below the knee or even a long skirt-like shawl around their waist. Their shoulders should also be covered. Usually skirts and shawls are available to use free of charge at the entrance of the Monasteries.

Visiting Mountain Villages and Peaks

- Depending on the season and the time of the day, the temperature may drop significantly at higher altitudes especially in the evenings. Therefore, carrying a jacket is recommended for your comfort.
- · Weather conditions such as humidity, clouds and haze may reduce the visibility and obstruct the views.

Visiting Gorges, Waterfalls and Lakes

- The volume of water you will encounter depends on the previous months' rainfalls. It may be significantly lower than expected or even inexistent especially in the hot summer season.
- Tempting though it may be to explore gorges and wild Cretan landscapes by yourself, it is strongly recommended that you are accompanied by an experienced local guide who is very familiar with the exigency of each terrain and can suggest which activity is most suitable for you.

Driving In Provincial and Mountain Roads

• Some extra care is required since goats, hares or other animals may catch you by surprise and suddenly appear in front of you in the middle of the road.

IERAPETRA



lerapetra is the southernmost town of Europe. Small but full of life, the so-called bride of the Libyan Sea, is the most important town on the southern coast of Crete and comes fourth in population. Its current name means sacred stone and before that was also known as Pytna and Kamiros. Facing the African coast lerapetra has a mild climate and rightfully earns a place among the most sun-kissed holiday destinations in the Old Continent. The temperature here hardly ever drops below 12°C /53.6°F and summers are hot and dry. Privileged with a unique microclimate lerapetra is one of the most productive farming towns of fruit and vegetables of Greece.

In ancient times it used to be one of the most important cities of Crete thanks to its strategic position. Though little is left to remind of its glorious past, the town of lerapetra has an impressive history with interludes being a Roman port and a Venetian stronghold as attested by the medieval fortress that is the landmark of the old harbor. The Ottoman period is still present by the few monuments and the narrow alleyways of the old Turkish quarter today called Kato Meria.

lerapetra is a calm town where everything takes place at its own pace. In the evenings the seafront is transformed into a vibrant esplanade with plenty of visitors swarming the Rakadika (little taverns one next to the other where you can drink Tsikoudia / Raki) and taste the local delicacies.

Apart from its enthralling history what truly makes the area of lerapetra so special and worth visiting is that it can be an ideal gateway for day trips and exploration of the easternmost part of Crete. The unique wilderness of the landscapes, the traditional mountain and seaside villages, the plateaus, the caves, the virgin forests, the beaches of incomparable allure, the wonderful gorges and waterfalls are only some of the natural beauties that promise to add to your experience and offer you a memorable holiday in Crete.

KALES FORTRESS

The medieval fortress Kales dominates the entrance of the ancient port of lerapetra. It was built by the Venetians in the 13th century AD, to protect the town from enemy attacks. Its name derives from the Turkish word Koules meaning tower in Turkish. Today the well-preserved castle host cultural events organized by the local municipality during the summer.



OTTOMAN SCHOOL – ARCHAEOLOGICAL COLLECTION

The Ottoman school or Mehtepi was built in 1899 for the Turkish kids of Ierapetra after Crete was liberated from the Ottoman rule. This landmark building is part of the town's history and today houses a tiny but important archaeological collection including Minoan, Geometric, and Roman artifacts. The exhibits that stand out are the beautiful statue of the goddess Perse, a fascinating mold of a Minoan ax and the Roman marble head of a man found near the ancient theatre of Viglia.



MOSQUE - OTTOMAN FOUNTAIN

The mosque of lerapetra in the old quarter of the town dates back to the end of the 19th century. When the Ottoman Turks conquered lerapetra, they modified the orthodox Christian church of Saint John into a Muslim house of worship. They added a minaret that dominates the district and an inscription from the Koran on the marble lintel of the entrance. Opposite the mosque there is a sebil fountain that was used by the Turks for ablutions.



OLD TOWN - NAPOLEON'S HOUSE

The oldest neighborhood of lerapetra called Kato Meria stretches along the seafront between the Ottoman school and the Kales fortress. The heart of the most picturesque part of the town beats in the peaceful cobbled streets and flowery yards of the houses that recall the past with their intriguing architecture.

One of the most bizarre attractions in the old city is Napoleon's House where according to the tradition Napoleon stayed for one night in July 1798. Sadly, the building is not well preserved, and the visitors have to use their imagination in order to revive the glory this House hides.

CHRISSI ISLAND - BELEGRINA BEACH

The Island of Chrissi is undoubtedly a little tropical heaven on earth. Surrounded by the Libyan Sea and only 8 nautical mi out of the coast of Ierepatra, this small island attracts every summer thousands of visitors who want the enjoy the shallow turquoise waters and the superb white sandy beaches. The rich natural setting is a mosaic of colorful volcanic rocks covered in gold sand, dunes, and a Juniper Forest unique in Europe. This landscape forms an inimitable ecosystem which is nominated as a natural wildlife refuge and is protected by the Natura 2000 Networking Programme; for this reason, removing stones and shells from the island is not allowed and visitors are kindly requested to move around the Junipers with caution in order to avoid breaking their branches.

The most beautiful beach is considered to be Belegrina or Golden Beach on the northern side of Chrissi Island. People reach the island by boats departing from Makrygialos and the port of lerapetra and after a 50' trip they are dropped off on the southern side. It takes less than a 10'walk through the juniper forest to arrive at the Golden Beach. Uncountable broken shells give the sand a pinkish color and turn the beach into a major attraction for geology lovers. On the east end of Belegrina lays a stunning geological sight consisting of thousands of fossilized shells. The beach is organized only with umbrellas and there is no snack bar selling refreshments or snacks.

BRAMIANA LAKE 12km/7.45mi west of NUMO Hotel, 20'

The artificial lake of Bramiana was inaugurated in 1986 in the middle of an arid area in order to meet the irrigation needs of lerapetra's central valley that is house to about 30.000 greenhouses. It is located 5km/3.1mi northwest of lerapetra next to the road towards Kalamafka village.

Lake Bramiana has become an important wetland and a resting point for migratory birds, where more than 214 species have been spotted. Rare species such as glossy ibises, great bitterns, white-eyed pilchards, black storks, kestrels and lanner falcons spend the winter in the safety of the lake's rich vegetation. Moorhens, grebes, coots, herons, seagulls, terns, and mallards can be observed from the bird-watching towers located on the shore. The largest populations of waterfowl in Crete also find shelter at this protected reserve.

In early spring the water level is at its peak whereas if during summer the water is at its lowest one can see the church of Prophet Elijah immerging from the lake. The dirt road that spreads around the lake is ideal for hiking and cycling enthusiasts.



KALAMAFKA VILLAGE
21km/13mi west of NUMO Hotel, 30'

Kalamafka is a lively and picturesque rural community and one of the most beautiful mountain villages of lerapetra. It is situated 15km/9.32mi northwest of the town and boasts a landscape of unique beauty; of geological formations, ancient caves, several small canyons, gorges, and an abundance of water that literally flows everywhere.

The landmark of the village is Kastellos, a unique limestone formation which is also called the "Meteora" of Crete thanks to its striking resemblance to the famous vertical rock formations in Thessaly of central Greece. The top of the cliff can be reached from the main square of the village and after climbing about 240 steps. This prominent rock was once the look-out of the village since its position was offering unobstructed views to the plain of lerapetra and the Libyan Sea.On top of Kastellos there is an impressive cave that used to be a sanctuary of the Minoan era. Today it is house to the cavernous chapel of the Holy Cross.

About 1km/0.62mi northwest of the village lays the Havgas gorge of Kalamafka.

The traditional settlement Anatoli (meaning sunrise in Greek) took its name by the first morning sun rays that flood the village. Throughout its long history, the village flourished during the Venetian domination and as indicate the ruins of the great Venetian Tower on its east end, the village, occupied a strategic position. Built amphitheatrically on the slopes of mountain Dikty at an altitude of 600m/1970ft., the settlement offers a magnificent view of the South Cretan Sea. The cobblestone paths, the natural fountains, the old buildings, and the beautiful rocky and mountainous scenery.

The mountain forest of Selakano is located on the southern slopes of Dikti mountain range and is undoubtedly one of the most spectacular and important surviving ecosystems of the island. It is protected by the Natura 2000 program and is one of the major pine forests (Pinus Brutia) of the entire Mediterranean. The largest beekeeping operations in Crete take place here and beekeepers from all over the island install hives in the area of Melissokipos (bee garden).

The honey produced in Selakano is of outstanding quality and has been granted Protected Geographical Status under European Union law. During the flowering period of the pines (July-September) the bees are swarming the forest and some extra care is recommended when we visit their territory. The landscape is captivating with gorges, springs and birds of prey adding to its wild beauty. Apart from the pine trees the rich vegetation includes among others plane, oak, juniper and maple trees. A magnificent route leads to Selakano village through the village of Males. A complex network of forest roads expands in the woods and is mainly used by the beekeepers.

SARAKINA GORGE 26km/16.1mi West of NUMO Hotel, 35'

The gorge of Sarakina is located at a short distance from the traditional village of Mithi. The gorge is 1.5 -2km/1mile long and 3m/9.8ft to 10m/32.8ft wide, offering visitors a chance to explore a magnificent landscape rich in vegetation, wildlife, and geological interest. The gurgling waters of River Kryos running in the heart of the gorge create beautiful pools and waterfalls. The impressive rock formations often as high as 150m/492ft are enhancing its wild beauty. Exploring the gorge, the visitor must occasionally climb over or pass under huge rocks that are spread over the whole length of the route. The walk is quite easy and the trail is well-marked; though when it becomes less apparent, the path is indicated with yellow arrows and red squares on rocks.

The start of Sarakina Gorge is located 1.2km/0.75mi north of Mithi Village. After you pass the center of the village you take the first turn right, follow the road downhill until you get to a bridge. You can park your car near the water treatment plant on the left side of the bridge. The gorge ends near the coastal village of Mirtos.

Mirtos is a small seaside village that maintains its traditional style, despite the development of the recent years that turned it into a popular resort. It is ideal for a pleasant stroll either in the picturesque narrow streets with the blossoming gardens or along the waterfront and the promenade with the numerous taverns and coffee shops. The village is boasting one of the finest beaches of southern Crete and is located at the output of a wide valley crossed by the River Kryos that flows through the imposing Sarakina Gorge.

The forested village of Kato Simi, along with the ruined village of Pano Simi, is hidden in the heart of the largest pine forest of Crete, neighboring with Selakano and Malles woods. This picturesque village, a nature lover's delight, lies in the embrace of caves, small plateaus, waterfalls, and springs that gather water from the slopes of Dikti Range and irrigate many species of trees such as plane, walnut, cherry, and others. Boasting such natural wealth, Kato Symi belongs to the EU's Natura2000 network which protects, and conserves threatened species and habitats.

A massive plane tree in the center of the village square offers its shade to the visitors, sheltering them from the hot sun in the summertime. Visiting the area, you may admire the small waterfalls and wander in the amazing forest that surrounds the village. You also have the chance to see the church Galatoktisti (built using animal milk (Gala) instead of water).

If you wish to go a little further it is worth wandering in the ancient sanctuary of Hermes and Aphrodite (5km/3.1mi,10'northeast of Kato Simi village). Another option is the Omalos Plateau with the beautiful Alpinelike lake (12km/7.45mi,30' northwest of Kato Simi).

The small and traditional village of Agios loannis is built at 500m/1640ft above sea level, at the slopes of the southern side of the Thripti mountain range. This little hidden paradise is placed in a magical landscape and this "natural balcony" offers unobstructed views to the Lybian sea.

Sadly, most of its inhabitants were compelled to leave the village looking for a better life and are now involved in tourism and agriculture (greenhouses) in the area of lerapetra. Despite the apparent traces of abandonment made obvious by the ruined and deserted houses, what makes this village attractive and worth visiting is that it nests in the heart of a unique pine forest extending from the area of Thripti Mountain up to the village of Schynokapsala. A beautiful mountainous 9km/5.6mi long route through the pine forest of Psychro connects Ag.loannis and the rich in waters Schynokapsala village.

ORINO VILLAGE 23.9km/14.8mi East of NUMO Hotel, 35' Via AGIOS IOANNIS & SCHYNOKAPSALA VILLAGE 26.4km/16.4mi East of NUMO Hotel, 45'

Orino village is the highest inhabited village of lerapetra region, built at the slopes of Thripti mountain and is overlooking the Lybian sea from an altitude of 620m/2034ft. This is yet another mountain settlement that suffered abandonment and decline when its inhabitants sought a better life closer to the town. Some newly restored houses are bringing an air of freshness and rebirth to this out-of-the-bitten-path village.

Mount Thripti, the fifth largest mountain range in Crete, is the perfect example of the wild beauty of Cretan nature. Gorges flanked by pine and brushwood and a distinctive pine forest prevail the landscape. The breathtaking view from its highest peak Afendis Stavromenos at 1476m/4842.5ft stretches from lerapetra to Sitia and offers a panoramic aspect of both the Cretan and the Lybian sea.



MILONA WATERFALL AND GORGE 7km/4.35mi East of NUMO Hotel, 15'

The Gorge of Milona (or Agios Ioannis gorge) starts near the village of Agios Ioannis and ends at the beach of Kakia Skala. The descent from the village is impossible due to a high waterfall whereas the gorge features several hiking trails some of which are rather demanding and canyoning equipment is necessary.

The most popular and easy hiking trail begins at Kaki Skala beach near the coastal village of Ferma. It is on the pinewood side of the gorge and a good part of it follows a concrete ditch. The ascent takes about 20' and leads to the 20m/65.6ft high waterfall of Milona. The spectacular waterfall is flanked by evergreen vegetation and surrounded by the imposing natural formations of the gorge like deep ravines, steep cliffs and numerous caves. Right underneath there is a small pond with crystal clear water, ideal for a refreshing jump in the water. Especially in winter and spring and after the rain season, there is plenty of water while in the summertime the water becomes much less.

There is another trail, though much longer and strenuous, that leads from Kaki Skala beach to the Falls if you follow the riverbed.

Orino village is surrounded by lush vegetation and many springs that supply with their waters one of the steepest rivers in Crete. After flowing through the main square of the village, the river enters the rugged gorge of Orino – a demanding descent that requires special equipment- and its abundant waters form impressive waterfalls and ponds. The highlight of Orino gorge is its last part where the river shapes three amazing waterfalls at Peristerionas spot.

The river continues its flow by entering the gorge of Red Butterflies and ends at Koutsouras beach. Despite the major fire that damaged the area in 1993 the vegetation of the gorge is still lush, whereas the population of the endemic red butterflies that find shelter here has declined dramatically. Spring-time visitors can still spot them enjoying nature, flying among the bushes and the wildflowers.

The entrance to the Butterfly gorge is 2km/1.24mi south of Orino settlement, where the Orino Gorge ends. Starting from Orino village and skipping the rough part of Orino gorge, it takes 3 to 4 hours through an indicated path to reach the end at Koutsouras beach.



STAVROCHORI 22.9km/14.2mi East of NUMO Hotel, 30'

The small humble houses of the village and the quaint narrow alleys which meet at the square in the center are a great example of traditional Cretan architecture with contemporary elements. Built at an altitude of 313m/1026ft the small Village of the Cross, as its name indicates, boasts the surprisingly large number of 24 churches and chapels.

The picturesque church of Saint Konstantinos on the south of the village stands out, as it is built next to a beautiful waterfall. The village offers magnificent views to the sea and visitors are also attracted by the main square with the pretty coffee shops and taverns where religious festivities and cultural events take place.



MAKRYGIALOS 20km/12.4mi East of NUMO Hotel, 25'

The coastal village of Makrygialos (meaning Long Beach) has flourished the last few decades as a popular holiday destination, especially among families. The fishing port is certainly the most picturesque part of the village, and the promenade is lined with a good variety of taverns, restaurants, bars and coffee shops promising to suit all tastes.

Before its tourist growth Makrygialos was just a small fishing village with few inhabitants. Its little harbour with a small number of storehouses used to serve as a hub from where the local agricultural products were exported to the rest of the island since the transport network was inadequate.

PEFKI PINE FOREST AND THE GORGE 26.6km/16.5mi East of NUMO Hotel, 35'

Pefki is a small and magnificent gorge with impressive rock formations and thriving vegetation. It is extending in a pine tree forest of unique beauty, whereas next to the riverbed one can see mostly plane trees and herbs.

The gorge is about 4.5km/2.8mi long and the crossing is easy and lasts approx. 2 hours. It starts a bit south of the beautiful and picturesque village Pefki and ends in Aspros Potamos settlement, 2km/1.24mi north of Makrygialos. On the south side of the gorge near the exit there is a spring of fresh cold potable water coming from the mountains, an ideal refreshing stop. The entrance of the gorge and the route are well-indicated with the typical black and yellow E4 signs of the European Trail. The path is quite clear and follows the riverbed almost in its entire length.

THRIPTI PLATEAU AND THE VILLAGE 24km/15mi North of NUMO Hotel, 45'

Thripti Plateau is located at Thripti mountain range at an altitude of 850m/2789ft and is beyond any doubt one of the most beautiful locations worth visiting in Crete. Apart from the well-known pine tree that embraces Thripti, Orino and Schynokapsala villages, the lush vegetation of the plateau includes many fruit trees like apple, pear, walnut, almond trees, and many vineyards.

Like many other mountain villages, the scenic village of Thripti suffered the abandonment by most of its permanent inhabitants, who moved closer to the urban centers chasing a better living. During weekends and summertime, the village becomes more lively attracting visitors who want to enjoy the countryside and the pleasant temperatures of the plateau. Very common is also the presence of farmers keeping their crops and shepherds herding their flocks on this fertile land.

The plateau can be easily reached through a paved road starting from the village Pano Chorio. A more adventurous and demanding option is following the dirt road starting from Orino village on the southern slopes of Thripti above Makrygialos. The Thripti mountain hiking trails are part of the European path E4 that begins in the Pyrenees mountain range, crosses the Alps, continental Greece and ends in Crete.

MASTORA WATERFALL – HA GORGE 20.2km/12.5mi North of NUMO Hotel, 35'

One of the best preserved parts of the Thripti pinewood, on the western part of the mountain range, is the starting point of Ha Gorge. Ha is one of the wildest and most imposing gorges in Europe as well as one of the most challenging to traverse. Apart from canyoning equipment, a lot of experience is definitely required. The impressive Gorge lies near the villages of Kato Chorio and Monastiraki at an altitude of 370m/1214ft. Thanks to it wilderness Ha is a virgin flora and fauna habitat beyond human reach. The lush vegetation of this protected environment is home to many mammals and its ponds are important wetlands offering shelter to endemic and migratory birds.

Towards the end of the gorge, waters falling from a height of 215m/705.3ft create the majestic Mastora waterfall, one of the highest known free falls in Greece. The water is flowing from springs located next to the village of Thripti right in the middle of the pristine pine forest. The Mastora fall is located just above the small village of Monastiraki and is visible from the plain that stretches west and below the village.

GOURNIA ARCHAEOLOGICAL SITE 21.6km/1.42mi North of NUMO Hotel, 25'

The Minoan settlement of Gournia is located on a hill west of Pachia Ammos village, northwest of lerapetra and is ranked as the best preserved excavated Minoan town in Crete. The excavations were performed in 1901-1904 by an American Archaeology Group under the guidance of Harriet Boyd. Named Gournia after the stone and wooden bowls (urns) that were discovered in the archaeological site, the town was flourishing in 1550-1450BC until it was destroyed by an earthquake in 1450BC. The last inhabitants abandoned the settlement around 1200BC leaving behind various objects and tools (chisels, hooks, hammers, pots, etc) that were found by the archaeologists and help us visualize the everyday life of the Minoans.

At the top of the hill, the excavations revealed a small palace along with an ample courtyard (the market), a primitive theater and a temple dedicated to the Goddess of Snakes. A stroll in the paved streets of the site unveils what the Minoan town must have looked like; there are two-storey houses with stairs taking to the second floor, workshops and storage rooms and an amazingly well-developed sewerage system.

PANAGIA FANEROMENI MONASTERY 29.2km/18.1mi North of NUMO Hotel, 30'

The historical Monastery of Panagia Faneromeni (Our Lady Revealed) or Virgin Mary of Gournia is a male monastery built on a steep slope at an altitude of 540m/1771.6ft. It is overlooking the Minoan city of Gournia offering at the same time incredible views to the sea. The fortress-like architecture along with the position where the Byzantine monastery is built, reflect its defensive character against the frequent pirate raids in the coasts of Crete.

The cavernous two-aisled church of Faneromeni is dedicated to the Dormition of Virgin Mary and to Zoodochos Pigi (Spring of Life). The spring inside it is believed to be miraculous. The monastery is one of the most well-known in eastern Crete and attracts pilgrims from all over the island on the 15th of August, the day of its celebration.

The city of Agios Nikolaos is an international cosmopolitan seaside resort attracting thousands of visitors every year. The capital of the prefecture of Lasithi took its name from the old church of Saint Nicholas, who is the patron saint of sailors in Greece.

The lake Voulismeni, the town's jewel, is 64m/210ft deep and connected with the sea through a narrow canal. It is surrounded by red rock formations and lush vegetation and is known for many legends according to one of which goddesses Athena and Artemis were bathing in these waters. Voulismeni Even the famous French oceanographer Jacques-Yves Cousteau was fascinated by this legendary lake and challenged to explore it.

Strolling around the shops of the town you will find unique traditional Cretan artifacts, copies of items exhibited in the local archaeological museums, jewels, and impressive embroidery. Elounda is considered as one of the most sophisticated holiday destinations attracting A-Listers from all over the world. In the bay of Elounda called Mirabello, is located the small island of Spinalonga, a significant attraction most known for its long and turbulent history. First called Kalydon, the island was renamed Spina Lunga (meaning long thorn) by the Venetians. In antiquity first it was used as a fortress, then during the Venetian era as a stronghold, during the Ottoman years was a settlement and a place of exile and towards the end of the 19th century became an important port.

After an aggressive outbreak of leprosy that stroke Greece, Spinalonga's fate as a leper colony was sealed on the 30th of May 1903, when Prince George decided to establish a leprosarium on the island. The total isolation provided by Spinalonga seemed to be more effective than any other measure and the islet became the place where all lepers from Crete and the rest of the country were quarantined. During the Nazi occupation and for fear of contacting the disease, not even the conquerors dared step foot on the island and were only sending supplies to the lepers. It was only in 1957 that the cure for leprosy (Hansen disease) was discovered and Spinalonga was gradually evacuated. After decades of neglect the buildings were restored recently and the island was transformed into an archaeological site and tourist attraction. In 2001 the history of Spinalonga Island inspired the British author Victoria Hislop to write the novel "The Island".

If you feel like driving a remarkable sinuous route in order to enjoy a magnificent panoramic view of Mirabello Bay, you can reach the area by taking the provincial road that leads from Neapoli (54.5 km/39 mi from NUMO Hotel) to Plaka (17.7 km/ 11 mi from Neapoli). This route will take you through picturesque villages, with Kastelli being the most charming of them.



KRITSA VILLAGE 47km/29mi from NUMO Hotel,50'

Clinging to the craggy foothills of the Dikti range, Kritsa is one of the oldest and prettiest mountain villages of eastern Crete. This centuries-old settlement is known for its traditional architecture, its cottage and textile industries, its festivals and celebrations, as well as the excellent quality olive oil it produces which has received international distinctions. The upper part of village with its web of narrow, car-free lanes is especially atmospheric and offers a variety of charming cafes where you can enjoy a traditional Greek coffee, shops exhibiting local products and surprisingly sophisticated boutiques. The area's flora includes many kinds of plants, herbs, flowers and rare trees, an impressive collection of which is held in the Rodanthi Museum. In Kritsa village were also filmed scenes from Jules Dassin's film 'He who must die", an adaptation of Nikos Kazantzakis' novel "Christ Recrucified".

In the surroundings of the village one can find the ancient ruins of Lato (3.5 km/2.2mi from Kritsa) and the church of Panagia Kera (1km/0.6mi before entering Kritsa) with its stunning Byzantine frescoes.

PANAGIA KERA BYZANTINE CHURCH

Panagia Kera, the three aisled arch-roofed Basilica with a dome is one of the most significant religious monuments in Crete and was built in two phases. The middle aisle, dating from the 13th century is the oldest of the three, since the church was initially built as single aisled one with a dome and was consecrated to the Assumption of the Virgin. The other two aisles were added later one by one. The unique way it was built, along with its incredible frescoes make this church one of the most important monuments of the area.

The oldest wall paintings (midst of the 13th century) survive in the sanctuary crevice. In this church one can find scenes from the apocrypha gospels of Jacob (south aisle), depictions of intense naturalism and sentimental expression, something very rare in Byzantine art. Particular mention should be made to the depiction of Saint Francis of Assisi in the central aisle of the church, as well as to the scenes from the occult gospels on the aisle of Agia Anna.



ANCIENT CITY OF LATO

Directly after the town sign "Kritsa" a signpost shows to the ancient site of Lato. Lato owes its name to the goddess Leto (Doric type of Lato), mother of Apollo and Artemis. It is one of the most important city-states of the Dorians in Crete and is considered the most well-preserved city of the classical Hellenistic period. It is built between two hills in a very strategic location. The center of the town at the top of the hill, offers breathtaking views to Agios Nikolaos town, Lato's ancient port.

At an altitude of 1150m/715mi and just 16km/10mi from Kritsa is the Katharo Plateau. The shepherds with their herds, the apple and oak trees, the stone walls all add to the unique beauty of this landscape. A narrow but beautiful road leads to the plateau through Kritsa. A fact worth mentioning is that Paleontologists find great interest in researching the plateau because of the fossils of elephants and dwarf-hippos that have been found in the 19th century and are dated around 540,000 years ago. This enhances their belief that Katharo used to be a lake where those prehistoric animals thrived.

LASITHI PLATEAU About 83km/51.6 mi from NUMO Hotel,1h50'

Standing over 850m/2789ft above sea level, the virgin and peaceful Lasithi Plateau, the largest in Greece, is surrounded by the imposing wild peaks of Dikti Mountains. It is one of the few residential insular areas in the Mediterranean at such high altitude. About 18 traditional villages with small or almost no population, with Tzermiado being the main one of them, are spread all around the highland and are linked with a circular road of over 23km/14mi. Apart from tourism, the local economy is supported by the famed agricultural produce of the region which is abundant thanks to the fertile soil and the unique microclimate. Some decades ago the plateau used to be swarmed with thousands of windmills irrigating the crops from natural underground water reservoirs. It is sad that today only few of them are still standing and are rightfully included among the most typical sights of the plateau.

TIP

Two entrances lead to the Lasithi Plateau. The first village you meet as you enter coming from Neapoli, is called Agios Georgios and is 83km (53.4mi) from NUMO Hotel. If you feel like exploring a little more, it is worth leaving from the northern exit near Pinakiano village 86km (60mi) from Numo Hotel. After 8km/5mi you turn right following the sign and enter Krasi village for a refreshing stop under the village's point of reference; a perennial huge plane tree, a monument of nature ranked among the 5 largest trees in Europe. It is 2400 years old, and the perimeter of its trunk is 24m/79ft. Beautiful arched fountains right next to it offer their cool and crystal clear water to the visitors. Around the plane tree square scattered taverns and cafes welcome you for a meal or refreshment. Reach the highway following the signs to Malia.



DIKTAION ANDRON (CAVE OF ZEUS)

One of the most important reasons visiting Lasithi Plateau is to explore the impressive Diktaion Andron Cave, also known as the Cave of Zeus or Cave of Psychro. Legend has it that God Zeus was born here, though the same claim is attributed to another cave on the Nida plateau. The first feel you experience as you enter the cave is the significant drop of temperature which in combination with the presence of wild rock doves and bats nesting in the dark creates an unearthly atmosphere. Over the millennia dripping stalactites and stalagmites have been forming the interior of the cave at an altitude of 1025m/3363ft. The cave extends for over 2200m/1.4mi and after a descent of 200 steps (same way up) following the well-marked path you reach the main chamber.

From the parking area it is an about 20'uphill walk. You have the choice between the quite steep old stone path with oak trees on either side that extends on the right or the newer paved one on the left, which is easier but more exposed to the sun. For those not wishing to walk there is also the option of a donkey ride from the parking to the entrance of the cave.

TIP

Start your journey in Lasithi Plateau by visiting the Cave first thing in the morning, since it is very popular among visitors and both the parking lot and the cave itself can get quite busy later in the day.

The 19th century monastery of Vidiani is located near the village of Kato Metohi at the feet of mountain Louloudaki. The surrounded with flowers monastery is dedicated to Zoodochos Pigi(Spring of Life) and a small fountain in the yard with the huge cypress trees symbolizes the spring of life and blossom. Remarkable is the carved icon-screen of the church and the stone carved windows with very elaborate masonry. The monastery is housing a small museum of natural history, a little shop selling herbs, an icon workshop and a small café where you can indulge in the nature under the shade of the trees. Access is very easy, as the peripheral road of the plateau runs just next to it.

KNOSSOS MINOAN PALACE 5.5km/3.4mi from HERAKLION, 15'

Knossos, the famous Minoan Palace lies only a few kilometers southeast of Heraklion in the valley of the river Kairatos. The river used to rise in Archanes, run through Knossos and reach the sea at Katsabas, the Minoan harbor of Knossos. In Minoan times the river flowed all year round and the surrounding hills were covered in oak and cypress trees, where today we see vines and olives. The pine trees inside the archaeological site were planted by Sir Arthur Evans, the British archaeologist responsible for the first excavations.

Constant habitation for 9,000 years has brought about great changes to the natural environment, so it is hard to imagine what the Minoan landscape was like. The first settlement in the Knossos area was established circa 7000 BC, during the Neolithic Period. The economic, social, and political development of the settlement led to the construction of the majestic Palace of Knossos towards the end of the second millennium BC. Knossos was the seat of the legendary King Minos and the main center of power in Crete.

The first Palace was destroyed circa 1700 BC. It was rebuilt and destroyed again by fire, this time definitively, in 1350 BC. The environs of the Palace were transformed into a sacred grove of the goddess Rhea but never inhabited again. The Palace of Knossos is the monumental symbol of Minoan civilization, due to its construction, use of luxury materials, architectural plan, advanced building techniques and impressive size.

HERAKLION CAPITAL TOWN 100km/62mi from NUMO Hotel, 1h30'

Heraklion being the capital town of Crete is the commercial and administrative center of the island. It is surrounded by a magnificent medieval wall indicating a great historical past. The imposing medieval fortress Koules or Rocca al Mare, as the Venetians named it, crowns the modern port being one of the most impressive landmarks of the town. Visiting Heraklion is the perfect chance for a pleasant stroll on the 25th of August Street, the most historical and beautiful street of the town, connecting the Venetian harbor to the Square of Lions.

This pedestrian road is dominated by the neoclassical architecture of very imposing buildings like the Venetian Loggia (meaning Noble Club), one of the finest monuments left by the Venetians in Crete, which today houses the municipal services of Heraklion. Right next to the Loggia is the Byzantine church of Saint Titos, one of the most important monuments in the center of the town, surrounded by the small cafes of a lovely square. The Loggia was built under the general captain Francesco Morosini, who gave his name to the beautiful fountain at the Lions square only a few steps away.

A little further from the square, on 1866 Street starts the central market of Heraklion, where one can find a mix of small cafés and taverns, shops selling souvenirs, items made of leather, fruit and vegetables, herbs and spices, cheese, and meat.



TIP

You can be part of the vibrant atmosphere of the always busy Lions square by people-watching, while indulging in the flavor of a traditional Bougatsa at Kirkor café. Bougatsa is a well-known Greek sweet, made of cream and dough with sugar and/or cinnamon on top.

TOPLOU MONASTERY

Main road 82.5km/51.3mi from NUMO Hotel,1h30' Provincial road 67.5km/42mi from NUMO Hotel,1h15' Toplou Monastery is one of the most historic of Crete and is located in the northeastern tip of the island in a harsh, almost desert-like landscape. Resembling a fortress with its 10m/33ft high wall that was protecting it from enemy attacks, it stretches in a square area of 800m2/8.611ft² and its most characteristic feature is the imposing 33m/108ft high belfry. The monastery is house to some very old and priceless icons and well-preserved frescoes dating back in the 15th century. Among the treasures that are exhibited in the museum are several old and historical religious items such as bibles, silvergilt crosses, Patriarchal Sigils, sultan decrees, seals, flags of the Greek revolution and vestments. Tradition has it that in the monastery there used to be 100 doors of which only 99 have been discovered. The monastery celebrates on September 26th and pilgrims from all over Greece visit the sanctuary to participate in the festivities.

The monastery takes great pride in its excellent organic products such as wine, honey, olive oil and raki. Right in the monastery you may find the winery and the small but welcoming wine tasting room. There you can taste the local wines and spirits assorted with traditional delicacies like cheese, olives and rusks (double baked bread) with tomato. All the wines for taste are also for sale at the monastery.

The mountain road via Vori & Chandras villages, 70km/43.5mi from NUMO Hotel,1h30' offers an interesting experience through picturesque villages and wonderful landscapes but is at the same time very narrow, winding and demanding.

Zakros is located in one of the remotest areas of eastern Crete and is mostly known for the Minoan Palace that was built at the outlet of the beautiful Gorge of Kato Zakros. The gorge is also called Gorge of the Dead because of the caves on its sides that were housing preminoan graves. The area is of great historical significance as many archaeological treasures were discovered here.

This particularly beautiful gorge can be accessed from Ano Zakros village. It is 4km/2.48mi long and crossing it will take about 2 to 3 hours. At the end of the gorge is the quaint seaside village of Kato Zakros with taverns and a beach with crystal clear water. The signed trail in the gorge is part of the E4 European trail. Visitors who parked their cars at Ano Zakros can return later by bus from Kato Zakros instead of having to walk back through the gorge.

The biggest and most important palm forest in Europe is here in Vai, next to one of the most famous beaches of Crete. The whole area is property of Toplou Monastery and was totally unknown until a popular commercial for the Bounty chocolate brand was filmed here in the early 1970s. The 5000 endemic Cretan Date palm trees are thriving thanks to the local warm and dry microclimate and offer shelter to birds heading to Africa stopping here during the migrating period.

Vai beach has golden sand with some fine pebbles and the water is usually calm. The beach is well organized providing the numerous visitors with facilities such as restrooms, sun loungers and straw umbrellas, water sports and wooden walkways for easy access; always to the point the protected environment is not disturbed. The beach is 200m/0.12mi walk from the parking area behind the forest and is considered easy for visitors with reduced mobility.

If you climb the steps that lead to the platform on the right side of the beach near the restaurant, you will be rewarded with the magnificent unobstructed views of the palm grove and the whole area.

This gorge of unbelievable natural beauty is located on the north side of Crete, between the towns of Agios Nikolaos and Sitia, and is one of the most well-known in Greece. The walk is approx. 3km/1.86mi long (3-4h) and stretches along Richtis river, passing through lush vegetation such as plane trees, oleander and sage. The route ends on a beach where hikers in the shade of tamarisk trees may enjoy the cool potable water of a fountain.

The highlight of the gorge is undoubtedly the beautiful Richtis waterfall, and the small pond formed below which is ideal for a refreshing dive. Even during the dry summers, the springs from the surrounding mountains still supply the gorge with enough water that falls from a height that exceeds the 20m/65.6ft.

The trail begins just outside the village of Exo Mouliana, at the stone-arched bridge of Lachanas and ends at the beautiful pebbly Richtis beach, east of the village of Kalavros. The elevation difference between the starting point and the beach is about 350m/1148ft. The bridge dates back to the 19th century when during the exchange of populations between Greece and Turkey, many people lost their lives at the battle that took place there.

TIP

Most visitors leave their cars on the main road at Exo Mouliana and walk down the paved road to Lachanas bridge. You may save about a 30'walk by driving and parking next to the bridge, from where reaching the waterfall takes around 1.5-2 h. The shortest way to reach the waterfall is to drive on the narrow paved road to the beach of Richtis and walk for about 30' in the opposite direction of the river.





TIP

In order to visit the easternmost part of Crete you may take either the main road that leads from lerapetra to Sitia via Pachia Ammos or the provincial one that takes you to Sitia via Koutsouras and Lithines village. The route of the main road is about 15km/9.3mi longer than the provincial one, with the first 19km/11.8mi up to Kavousi village being a very easy drive, followed by a winding road up to Hamezi village before Sitia town. The provincial route on the other hand, is shorter and offers a landscape of amazing natural beauty.







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
